

# **Policing - Level 3 Access to Higher Education Diploma**

Capital City College and the Met Police work closely to deliver this exciting and innovative programme. To show their support, any course fees that have been incurred will be reimbursed to you by the Met Police if you are subsequently accepted as a Police Officer.

The Access to Higher Education Diploma: This is a part-time course delivered through a combination of remote online tuition and face-to-face sessions.

Policing is a fantastic opportunity for those looking to join the police service or work within the fields of crime, criminology, or law. The course has been designed in partnership with the Met Police Service to prepare students for a career in the police service and is purposely aligned for progression to the Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship Program. For those who wish to progress to university to study at degree level, the Access to Higher Education Diploma is a nationally recognised Level 3 qualification perfect for anyone looking to start a university course.

If you would like to study Policing or Criminology at university but left school without the qualifications you need, then this Access to HE course could be for you. Each year, over 20,000 Access to HE students apply for a degree course at a UK university; if you go on to complete a relevant degree at university, your Advanced Learner Loan will be written off by Student Finance England.

The Access to Higher Education Diploma is a nationally recognised Level 3 qualification perfect for anyone looking to start a university course, with no formal qualifications. The Access to HE Diploma: Policing provides HE progression opportunities and widening gateway access for adults who do not have the necessary two A levels or an equivalent Level 3 qualification (as defined in the Education and Skills Act 2008) to enter the Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship Program. City and Islington College has worked closely with the Metropolitan Police to provide a broadening access program based on sound theoretical education and vocational training.

This course will help you get the qualifications you need to study policing or criminology, or a related course, at university. The qualification will provide you with a broad understanding of crime and the criminal justice system, whilst also addressing the psychological techniques used by investigators to assist in the detection of crime. The Policing Education Framework 2020 includes a need for new applicants to have a Foundation Degree and you will require a Level 3 qualification,

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such as this Access to HE Diploma, in order to access a Foundation Degree.

You will also have a personal tutor who will support you during the year and who will advise you on your applications to higher education institutions.

## WHAT WILL I STUDY?

Teaching occurs through a combination of lectures at our Angel centre in Islington, or online via Microsoft Teams.

Teaching is by experienced practitioners in the field including ex-Police Officers, Forensic specialists, and through a series of subject-specific guest lectures from working criminal justice professionals.

Topics covered include:

- Introduction to Policing
- Conflict Management within Policing
- Intelligence and Information Gathering in Policing
- Principles of Conducting a Police Investigation
- Arrest, Remand, and Bail Procedures
- Evidence-Based Policing
- Communication Skills in a Police Service Setting
- Local Policing
- Police Ethics and Values
- Criminal Justice System and Victim Care
- Crime and Deviance

This course is a part-time course run over 3 days however this can vary.

## WHAT WILL I NEED?

You will need:

- GCSE English grade 4. Alternatively, you must demonstrate the ability to read, write, speak, and understand English at this level. (Please note that achieving a GCSE English grade 4 or an equivalent Level 2 English qualification is a requirement before applying to the Metropolitan Police)
- Maths GCSE is recommended however if not achieved this can be studied alongside your Access to HE Diploma.

## HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

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This course is assessed through coursework assignments, tests, and examinations throughout the course, which are set and marked by your teachers and externally moderated by OCN London.

Assessment is continuous over the whole year and is based on a number of set pieces of work such as essays, projects, presentations, and tests.

## WHAT WILL IT COST?

ADULTS - ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION

If you will be aged 19 to 23 prior to the start date of your course, and do not already have a full Level 3 qualification, you may be eligible for a Level 3 entitlement, in which case your study with us will be free. Otherwise, you will have to pay the fees yourself or apply for an [Advanced Learner Loan](#).

## WHAT CAN I DO AFTER?

Once you have completed your Access to HE course, you can progress to a Higher Education Degree at a university or college.

Learners primarily progress to Higher Education studies in areas related to Criminology. These may include some of the following areas of Degree-level study: Criminology, Crime Scene and Forensic Investigation, Criminal Psychology, Policing, and a range of combined and related Degrees.

Learners can also onto a Police Apprenticeship Degree, which is a vocational course that focuses on practical learning and is specifically tailored to help learners start their career in policing.
