The Textiles course within the Creative Practice and Communication specification (UAL) is structured across modules that provide a comprehensive understanding of textile design, material exploration, and creative practices.

Year 1: Foundation and Fundamental Concepts

Introduction to Textile Techniques: Foundational modules cover basic textile techniques such as weaving, printing, dyeing, and surface embellishment. Students learn fundamental skills in textile manipulation and construction.

Material Exploration: Emphasis on exploring a variety of textile materials, fibres, and surfaces. Students experiment with different fabrics, yarns, and sustainable materials to understand their properties and applications.

Textile Design Fundamentals: Introduction to design principles applied to textiles. Students learn about colour theory, pattern development, and textile design concepts through workshops and projects.

Textile Design Studio Practice: Specialised design studios focusing on specific aspects of textile design, such as print design, knitwear, or sustainable textiles. Emphasis on developing a unique design style and conceptual approach.

Textile Contextual Studies: A deeper exploration into historical, cultural, and contemporary influences on textile design. Students study trends, sustainability in textiles, and the impact of technology on the industry.

Industry Collaborations and Professional Practice: Engagement with industry partners, live projects, or internships in textile design studios or manufacturing units. Real-world applications and experiences provide practical insights and skill enhancement.

Final Major Project and Portfolio Development: Culmination of the course with a major individual project, often accompanied by a comprehensive portfolio showcasing the students' best work and proficiency across various textile design domains.

This structured breakdown ensures a progressive learning trajectory, covering foundational concepts in the initial year and allowing students to specialise, apply advanced skills, and prepare for professional roles in the dynamic field of textile design by the end of the program.

WHAT WILL I NEED?

You will need:

- Four GCSEs at grade 4 or above, including English Language or Maths or an equivalent Level 2 qualification at Merit (and Functional Skills in English at Level 2/GCSE English Language at grade 4 or above)
- A portfolio of your art and design work

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All applicants must have an interview to confirm that the course is suitable for them.

HOW WILL I BE ASSESSED?

The assessment methods for the Textiles course within the Creative Practice and Communication specification (UAL) employ various techniques to evaluate students' theoretical knowledge, practical skills, creativity, and their application in the field of textile design and innovation.

Project-Based Assessments: Students complete a series of textile design projects throughout the course. These projects involve designing and creating textiles using various techniques like weaving, printing, or surface embellishment. Assessments evaluate creativity, technical proficiency, and the ability to translate concepts into tangible textile designs.

Portfolio Development: Students compile a comprehensive portfolio showcasing their best work, demonstrating their progression, skills, and versatility in textile design. This portfolio serves as a summative assessment of their abilities over the course duration.

Presentations and Critiques: Students present their textile projects to a panel of faculty, industry experts, or peers. This assessment method evaluates their communication skills, ability to articulate design concepts, and respond to critiques effectively.

Technical Skills Assessment: Evaluation of technical skills in textile manipulation, construction, printing, and digital design tools. This assesses proficiency in utilizing various textile techniques and technology for design purposes.

Written Assignments and Reflections: Assessments may include written assignments, critical reflections on design processes, textile trends, sustainability in textiles, or analytical essays related to textile design theories and practices.

Sustainability and Ethical Considerations: Assessment of students' understanding and application of sustainable practices and ethical considerations in textile design and production.

Final Project Evaluation: Culmination of the course with a major individual project, accompanied by an assessment focusing on innovation, creativity, design process, and the ability to address contemporary challenges in textile design.

These diverse assessment methods ensure a comprehensive evaluation of abilities, readiness for the textile industry, and their capacity to create innovative, sustainable, and visually compelling textile designs, preparing them for roles as textile designers, material researchers, or industry innovators.
